Message from Principal Lam:

Big thanks for Staff Appreciation in December. Other principals were impressed by the photos that Principal Lam shared.

Our graduation falls on Eid. This impacts our Muslim population. Lam is in discussion with Central Office to get the date changed. Some student groups are organizing as well. Garfield and Center School are also impacted by this. Lam does not know what goes into the scheduling so not sure if it is a possibility to change the date but trying to.

A licensed mental health clinician is coming here one full day per week starting soon. There are other organizations coming to provide support as well. Creating space for people to meet for counseling.

Entering budget season, starts after mid-winter break. We get a budget allocation, how many teachers and how much money in discretionary funds. Family income survey impacts this. Anticipating budget cuts, even worse than last year. \$30M shared across the schools, \$100M cut to central office. Looking for creative strategies, such as asking the Chinese govt to fund our Chinese teacher, as an example.

Q: What can community do to support the budget process?

A: Time between budget allocation to creating budget is 3 weeks! Tight turnaround! Will share updates at future PTSA meetings. Will engage community in where cuts get made. Want families and students to help make these challenging decisions.

Elective options are often on the chopping block. We have twice as many science classes than other schools, we may take a hit there.

Q: Will budget cuts impact effort to increase AP offerings?

A: Probably not, these don't come with a lot of extra costs. Teacher training is the main cost. Many people have mixed feelings about the College Board, which controls AP testing. The administration is looking in to other opportunities besides AP, such as UW credit courses in humanities and languages. These classes are low risk. If a student gets a good grade, it will go on their college transcript. If they get a low grade, they can opt to not have the grade go on their college transcript. Cleveland staff are meeting with UW representatives tomorrow (1/10) to discuss.

Q: Do we have an Building Leadership Team (BLT)? And is there family representation? A: Yes we have BLT, but no family representation. Would like to have multiple students/families.

Q: If graduation cannot be moved, can we have a separate Muslim graduation, possibly with other schools?

A: Looking into possibility of separate graduation. 25-30% of population is East African, and a large percentage of them are Muslim. There are also Muslim staff members who are affected by this.

Asian Student Union Presentation - Lunar New Year Festival

Lunar New Year celebration is scheduled for Tuesday Feb 13. There will be activities and food at 6pm-7:30 and performances at 7:30-8pm. Purpose of event is to bring in community to celebrate lunar new year.

The festival will be held on the first floor of building 2. The intent is to have a night market feel, with dim lighting and fairly lights. There will be a raffle table for other clubs to create gift baskets and other prizes.

Food will be free, thanks to the mental health grant.

There will be activies and a bingo sheet. Completion of a bingo sheet will get you a raffle ticket. Activities include red envelope decorating, calligraphy demonstration, pin the tail on the dragon, Bau cua ca cop (Vietnamese gambling game), origami table, Chopsticks game, Vietnamese horse board game. There may also be a photobooth.

Performances include lion dance, fan dance and kpop dance. Reaching out to other schools for other performances.

Raffle will be after performances.

The ASU is looking for a caterer and also for parent volunteers to set up, take down help with food service and activities.

Q: How many adult volunteers will be needed?

A: 10-20.

Q: Do you expect students only to attend, or families?

A: Families and community.
